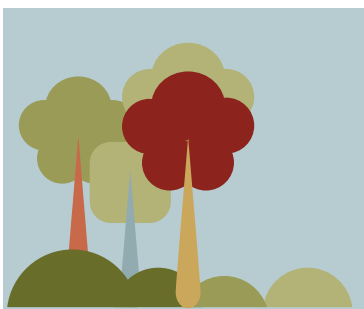

Mid-Week Adult Bible Study

Wednesdays 6:30–7:15 p.m. Social Room.

Our mid-week adult study this fall is called In Depth. It will be an interactive Bible study. Dr. Milton Horne leads off August 24–September 28 with an in depth look at the book of Exodus. Milton is Professor of Religion at William Jewell.

Following the Exodus study, we'll take a look at the Psalms with Dr. Barry Speert a Jewish scholar with an advanced degree from Yeshiva University, in New York City. Barry Speert has taught Biblical Studies at Baker University and Saint Paul School of Theology.

Schedule for Study of Exodus 1–24

August 24–September 28 (six successive Wednesdays)

Aug. 24: The Exodus story in the New Testament. This study invites readers to reflect upon the import of the Exodus story to the narrative and theology of the story of Jesus. The argument will be that Christians cannot understand their own faith unless they can frame it in terms of the Exodus story.

Aug. 31: Exodus 1–2

The nature of slavery and freedom in the Exodus story. In this session, readers are invited to consider the nature of God's promise of deliverance by exploring the elements of slavery (political, economic and religious) and redemption.

Sept. 7: Exodus 3–4 God and Moses.

The two main characters in this narrative are God and Moses. This study reflects upon key features of both characters as they lead Israel, God's people, to freedom.

Sept. 14: Exodus 5–15

This lengthy passage, which contains the

events of God's plagues, the slaughter of the first-born Egyptian children, the deliverance by the sea and Miriam's song, considers how the God of creation intervenes to deliver his people. The session explores the relationship between creation and salvation as key theological touchstones.

Sept. 21: Exodus 16–18

These short chapters contain the opening narratives of Israel's wilderness experiences (resumed in Numbers 11ff). Later biblical interpreters consider this experience as definitive in shaping the nature of Israel's relationship to God.

Sept. 28: Exodus 19–24

The unit of study concludes with the climactic formulation of a covenant between God and his people. Readers notice that it is a covenant of laws that are binding upon God's people. To what is God bound? Does this mean it is not a covenant of love?

I Am Second

PHYLLIS CHATLOS:
"SECOND BAPTIST, MY CHURCH HOME"



Phyllis Chatlos

I've known Phyllis Chatlos since the 60s when she and I were students at William Jewell. Most recently, I've come to know her as an award-winning high school teacher and skilled seamstress. But know her as a visitor at her own church? No way. Though to my surprise, and maybe yours, that's exactly where Phyllis' story for I AM SECOND gets started before it takes a

century-long look into our church's and her family's parallel histories. And so, if you haven't made her acquaintance already, say hello to Phyllis Newman Chatlos, and if you HAVE known her for what seems forever, read Phyllis in her own words, and come to know her even better.

"A few years ago," Phyllis begins, "My husband Ken and I were asked at church one Sunday if we were visitors." (Didn't I tell you?) "Then and there," she writes, "I decided it was time to reintroduce myself and my family to the Second Baptist Church community." (And here she is in I AM SECOND to do just that!)

"My connection to Second Baptist," Phyllis remembers, "Began over one hundred years ago when my grandparents, John and Rosa Payne, and their four children, Weslie, Houstin, Gertrude, and Elaine, moved to Liberty. They made this move so that my grandfather could attend the William Jewell Academy and then study at William Jewell College. He had been called by God into the ministry and needed a good education. At the same time, the Payne family joined Second Baptist Church. During these 'early' years in Liberty, my grandparents had four more daughters, Zena, Edna, Emma (my mother) and Eleanor. After my grandfather graduated from Jewell, he and his family moved to Concordia, Missouri where he became pastor of a Baptist church.

"In 1925 the Payne family returned to Liberty and Second Baptist. Soon after, another daughter, Edith, was born. Edith Payne Smith, still a member at Second, is the only living sibling left in the Payne family. (Phyllis thinks it's quite possible her Aunt Edith has been a member of 2BC longer than anyone else in its history.)

"At Second, my grandmother Rosa helped start the Cradle Roll, now known as 'the nursery.' She also visited young mothers in the church—a MOPS Mentor Mom pioneer for sure. Her son Weslie was licensed to preach in our church and four of the Payne daughters were married here—Zena to Nelson Page, Edna to George Milligan, Emma to Dawson Newman (my parents), and Edith to Phil Smith.

"After my parents were married, they left Liberty, but only for a few years, returning 'home' a year before I, Phyllis June Newman, their second daughter, was born. Right away, I was a 2BC kid, my life revolving around Second Baptist. Its activities and membership shaped my life, especially because as a child, I was only allowed to participate in church activities. I knew more hymns than popular music and still do.

"Each year in those days, Second had a week-long revival. Dr. Forrest Feezor, a former pastor of 2BC and good friend of my mother's family, conducted the revival the year I was ten and it was at that revival I professed my faith in Christ. Shortly after, I was baptized by our pastor, Dr. Bill Link. I was involved in GAs (called Girls Auxiliary then) and worked my way through to the rank of Queen with a Scepter. Every Sunday was church day for our family. We had Sunday school, youth activities, Training Union, and, of course, morning and evening worship. I spent two weeks each summer in Vacation Bible School.

“As a young teenager, I competed in Bible Drill (we called it Sword Drill). Bible Drill contests were held at our church, between children in the Clay-Platte Association, and at the state level. Our youth choir, of which I was a part, sang every Sunday morning from the balcony. During high school I helped in the church nursery. Some of the children I cared for then are adults in our church now, for instance, Sue Imbler Hasty. Some like Martha Bray are still known to many of us but live elsewhere. In the summers, I joined 2BC high school youth at Windermere, our Baptist state camp. Among our counselors at that retreat was Bill Riggs. During my college days at William Jewell, I taught first-grade Sunday school class, one of my students being Mark Bowles.

“Throughout these same years and more, my father taught a junior boys’ Sunday school class. Some men in the church today including Harvey Seely, Dan Triplett, and John Hilton still remember him as their teacher. He also operated the PA and radio systems, and served faithfully as a deacon. My mother was active in WMU, and my sister, Delores, organized a program in which college students were ‘adopted’ by 2BC families. Year after year, my family hosted many, many college students and visiting missionaries, especially for Sunday dinners.

“Once I received my undergraduate degree from Jewell, I left for graduate school in Lincoln, Nebraska, where I met Ken Chatlos. Indirectly Harvey Thomas was responsible for our meeting because he had been instrumental in helping me choose the University of Nebraska for my further education. Ken and I were married at Second Baptist Church on June 5, 1971, Dr. W. C. Link, Jr. and Rev. Charles Newman, my father’s twin brother, officiating. Lydia Lovan, 2BC’s church organist, played at our wedding. When Ken was contracted to teach history at William Jewell College in 1973, we moved to Liberty and soon became 2BC church members. I found a job teaching math, first at Liberty Junior High School, and then at Liberty Senior High School.

“As I had when I was a child, our two sons, Jeffrey and David, also participated in

2BC activities growing up. We lived only a few blocks away from Second in those days, around the corner from Don and Neita Geilker, around a different corner from Steve Hemphill’s first Liberty house, and across the street from Jerry Cain’s family. Both boys professed faith in Christ and were baptized at Second Baptist. Jeff followed in my footsteps and competed in Bible Drills at all levels. I’m certain the boys could tell you plenty more about their 2BC experiences in Sunday school and RAs, at church music and youth camp, and mission trips if this were solely their story. Just the other day, Jeff reminded us that he preached at Second twice in the role of student minister.

“Ken and I have served on various committees at Second, including Finance, Library, Music, and Flowers, and we sang in the church choir together. I led a GA group which included Amy Brown and Teresa Posey. The two of us helped start a Sunday school class for ‘young’ couples, mostly couples with small children. Several of us from this class organized the first Second Baptist Baby Sitting Co-op. We exchanged coupons for babysitting. Life-long friendships developed from this Co-op. Once the boys were older, I took responsibility for the Kindergarten Sunday School class, and not long after, Ken joined me. Later, Ken taught a Sunday school class for parents of middle school children. This class stayed together until most of our children were out of college.

“My parents celebrated their 40th and 50th wedding anniversary receptions at our church. Eventually, my father graduated from teaching in the junior department to teaching an adult men’s Sunday school class. He served as church clerk for many years and my mother was Sunday school secretary. They say that ‘what goes around comes around.’ As a child, my family had ‘our seats’ in the balcony, moving later to the main level of the sanctuary. Now, Ken and I have what we call, ‘our seats,’ and THEY are in the balcony. From our point of view, we’re observing many younger adults taking on positions of leadership at Second and that pleases us.

“Today, I am a member of the Arts and Environmental Flower Committee, which makes sure that our sanctuary has flowers each Sunday and is decorated for Christmas and Easter. Along with Irene Thomas and Sue Wright, I greet those who, on Sunday mornings, enter our church from Franklin Street. Ken talks to the children as a ‘special person’ at Christmas time—the special person with the white beard and the red suit.

“Ken and I are retired now. Our sons are married, and we have two wonderful grandchildren. And that’s about it. Since you’ve heard my story and seen my picture, I hope you will be more likely to think of me—and equally as important—of my family, as ‘permanent fixtures’ and not ‘visitors’ at 2BC.”

I’m convinced, Mrs. C., but of course, I’ve never thought of you as anything but a permanent fixture around Second Baptist. From Second’s beginnings, you and your family have always been more than a footnote in our church’s history. You’ve BEEN its history! And I might add—an enduring and endearing page in its present, and most surely, in its future. Ho! Ho! Ho!
